I hope you all had a wonderful Canada Day...as much as we need to focus on ways to make our country better, we should never lose sight of how wonderful this place really is. We're a country that shouldn't have worked, but somehow it did. Most of the world would love to have our problems and if the example we've set on how disparate groups can live together and create good things in the name of 'the common good' could be duplicated elsewhere on the planet, it would be a safer, happier and more prosperous place. We have a lot to offer the world; as U2's famous lead singer, Bono, said, 'the world needs more Canada."

As mentioned previously, a theme is emerging that clearly differentiates Liberals from the NDP. A week ago, Justin Trudeau released the Party's 'green platform', which involved a Liberal promise to work collaboratively with the provinces to come up with carbon reduction targets and programs to reach them. This drew an immediate response from the NDP that this approach demonstrated a lack of leadership from Mr. Trudeau. Mr. Mulcair believes that the role of government is to establish national programs and have them implemented by the provinces, so, for example, if the NDP believes in a cap and trade strategy to reduce carbon output, all provinces would be asked to put such a program in place. The NDP approach would ignore BC's highly successful carbon pricing program whereas the Liberals would be happy to have it in place as this province's contribution to the overall effort.

The NDP's centralized approach that would try to convince provinces not only *what* they needed to do but also *how* to do it would be a recipe for accomplishing very little except for extended bouts of wrangling. Mr. Mulcair's national daycare strategy, carbon reduction strategy and senate reform (abolition or nothing) all fall into that category. Mr. Trudeau's approach is more respectful of the provinces and a far superior fit with the way Canadians have made their country work for the past 148 years.
